In order to advance Islamic work in Toledo, our community requires programs that train, develop, and qualify future leaders. While there are many high-quality activities in the community, there is a noticeable gap in the area of human resource development and leadership training. There is also a lack of organized effort to empower da'wah work and train people in the methodology of calling to Islam.
